**Dr. Marshall P. Duke** Dr. Marshall P. Duke is the Candler Professor of Psychology at Emory University. His books include *Abnormal Psychology: A New Look*, *Inside Psychotherapy, Will I Ever Fit In?*, *Helping the Child Who Doesn't Fit In*, *What Works with Kids*, and *Teaching Your Child the Language of Social Success*. The author of more than 80 research articles,

he has served as Chair of the Department of Psychology and Director of the University psychological Center. He has been a core faculty member of Emory's Center for the Study of Myth and Ritual in American Life. His work has been described in the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, Washington Post and Boston Globe among others and he has appeared on National Public Radio, The Today Show, Good Morning America and the Oprah Winfrey Show.



### **Dr. Kathleen Hopkins**

Dr. Kathleen Hopkins has been involved in the field of education for over 40 years. She received her doctorate in education from the College of William and Mary, and since 1991 has been Executive Director of the National Institute for Learning Development (NILD). Dr. Hopkins is also an instructor for the Feuerstein Program of Instrumental Enrichment and studied in Israel and France to receive this distinction. This workshop is designed to provide experienced NILD educational therapists training in administration, scoring and interpretation of the WJ III Tests of Achievement. The content focuses on theoretical background, technical overview, basal and ceiling rules, computing raw scores, obtaining estimated and grade-equivalent scores, administration of new tests, using Compuscore and Profiles Program and building examiner competency. Included are practice exercises, interpretive options, test observations checklist, examiner training checklist, and a case study. Optional: Bring a copy of the WJ III Achievement Standard Test Book.

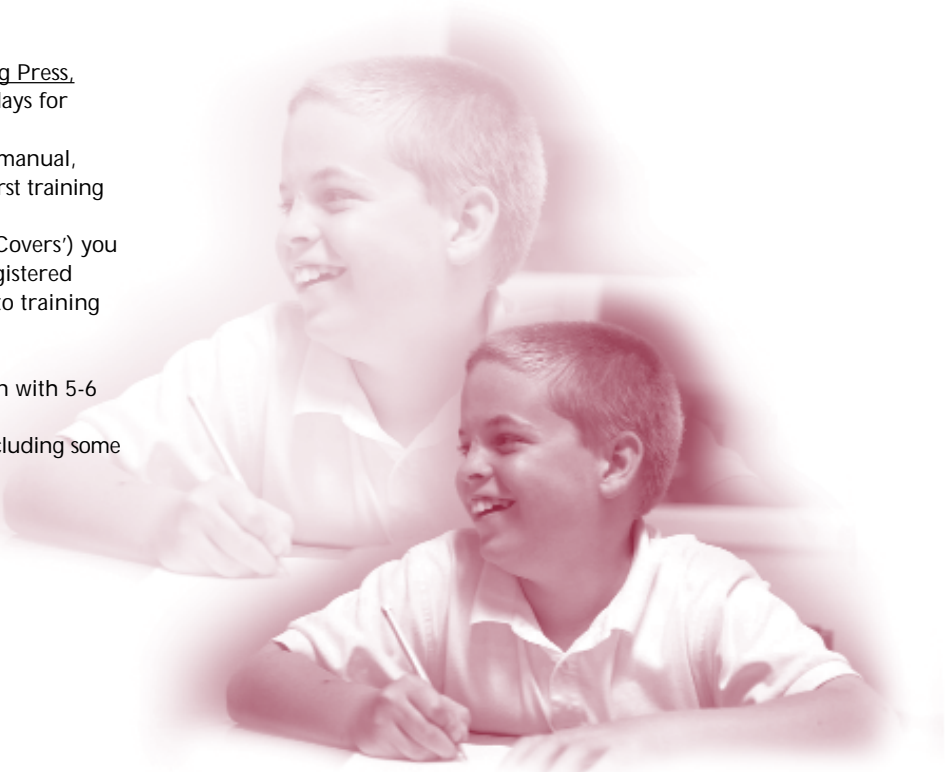

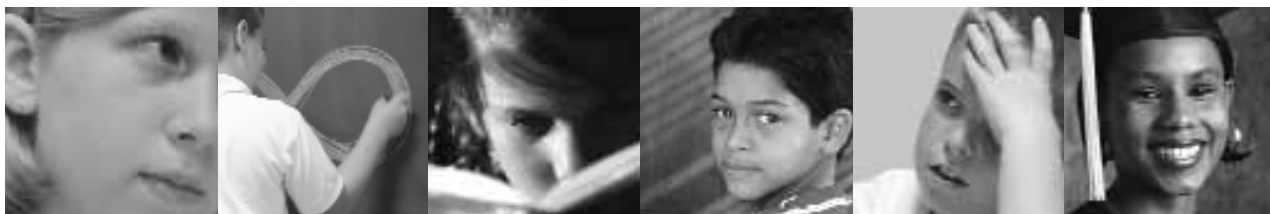
